

Moving to the Gold Coast



Suburb overview: Sample Suburb

The sample suburb is located in the northern Gold Coast, on what's considered the Gold Coast's 'North Shore'. The sample suburb was planned for a population of 10,000 people, with amenities and facilities servicing Suburb-x, Suburb-y and Suburb-z including parks, shops, a golf course, medical and sporting facilities. The first homes in the area were completed in 1976.

The sample suburb now is one of the larger GC suburbs with 18,689 residents, covering just over 20 km2. It features 99 parks, reserves and playgrounds covering nearly 16% of the total area.

In the north of the suburb, large family homes are surrounded by trees and set into the hills, while the valley is characterized by large free-standing homes and townhouses on quiet cul-de-sacs and some premium waterfront properties can be found along its waterways in the north.

The median house price increased 30% over the past 5 years, currently sitting at \$800,000 for a house and \$370,000 for a unit. Houses in Sample Suburb rent out on average for \$700 per week, with an annual rental yield of 4.6% and units rent for \$445 per week with a rental yield of 6.3%.

It is classed as a predominantly low-density area, with approx. 75% of people owning their own home, while 25% are renters. People tend to stay in the area for a long time, the average home ownership is 10 years showing stability and an overall satisfaction with the area. There's a below average number of social housing in the suburb.

The suburb is ranked 13th on the Gold Coast in terms of socio-economic advantage** with an index of 1,035 and a 74 percentile which means a population that is generally higher skilled with higher income.

The crime rate however is relatively high, ranked 15th highest across all GC suburbs with a rate of 80.5 per '000 residents. The fact that there are three major shopping centers contributes to this, with a clear concentration of crimes reported in and around these precincts.

The suburb offers great connectivity via train and the M1 to Brisbane and other areas of the Gold Coast, and is also connected via the light rail to Broadbeach.

There's a state primary & high school, fire station, public library, a number of retirement villages and gated communities and general services & facilities like GPs, dentists and optometrists.

The suburb lacks in terms of cafes, restaurants and bars, and if you're looking for entertainment or nightlife, you'll be disappointed.

This suburb is great for families and retirees looking for a green and friendly living environment, great connectivity to Brisbane and with all amenities right on your doorstep.



Glossary / Footnotes:

¹Mobility data indicates the level of residential mobility, (or stability) within an area. It is represented as a percentage of the population (persons aged 5+) of the suburb that have moved in the last five years (census 2016 vs 2011).

²SEIFA Index of Relative Socio-economic Advantage and Disadvantage (IRSAD) summarizes information about the economic and social conditions of people and households within an area, including both relative advantage and disadvantage measures.

- A low score indicates relatively greater disadvantage and a lack of advantage in general. For example, an area could have a low score if there are:

- many households with low incomes, or many people in unskilled occupations, AND
- few households with high incomes, or few people in skilled occupations.

- A high score indicates a relative lack of disadvantage and greater advantage in general. For example, an area may have a high score if there are:

- many households with high incomes, or many people in skilled occupations, AND
- few households with low incomes, or few people in unskilled occupations.

The percentile indicates the approximate position of this small area in a ranked list of Australia's suburbs and localities. It's meant to give an indication of where the area sits within the whole nation. A higher number indicates a higher socioeconomic status. For instance, a percentile of 72 indicates that approximately 72% of Australia's suburbs have a SEIFA index lower than this area (more disadvantaged), while 28% are higher.

³Crime rate: The suburb crime score takes into account the population of a suburb and the total number of offences reported in the previous 12-month period. This includes all types of petty and major crimes including Assault, Robbery, Drug Offences, Fraud, Traffic Offences, Theft, Unlawful Entry etc. The score is represented per 1,000 residents. (Number of offences / population x 1,000)
